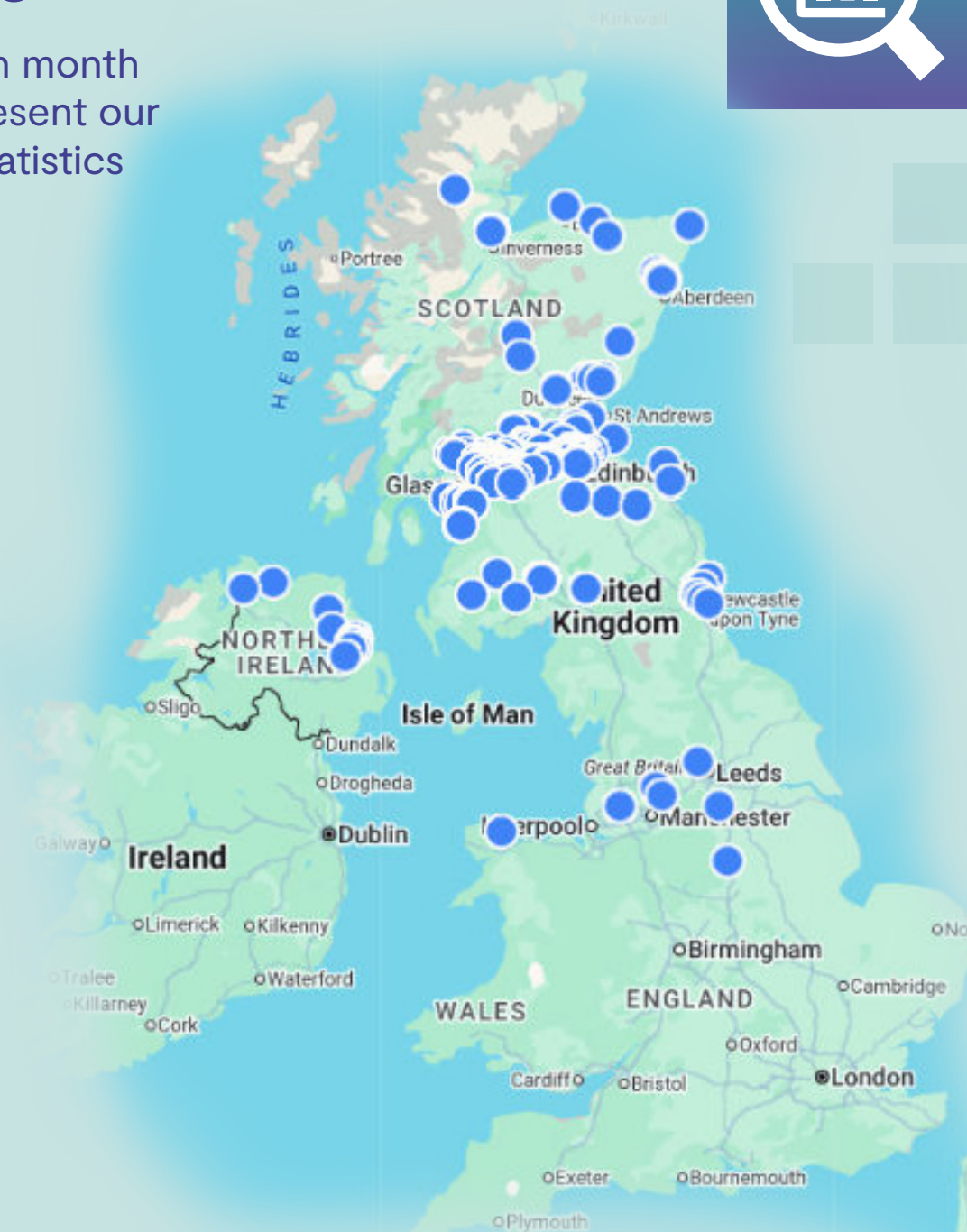

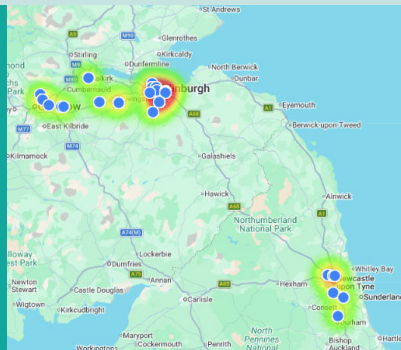

RAC On The Road

Our latest Glasgow City Centre Day of Action on 10th June delivered another strong response to retail crime, with Police Scotland reporting:

- 42 stop searches, including 10 positive results**
- 22 individuals reported for offences, including 16 shoplifting offences**
- 8 dispersal warnings issued**
- 2 apprehension warrants executed on known shoplifters**
